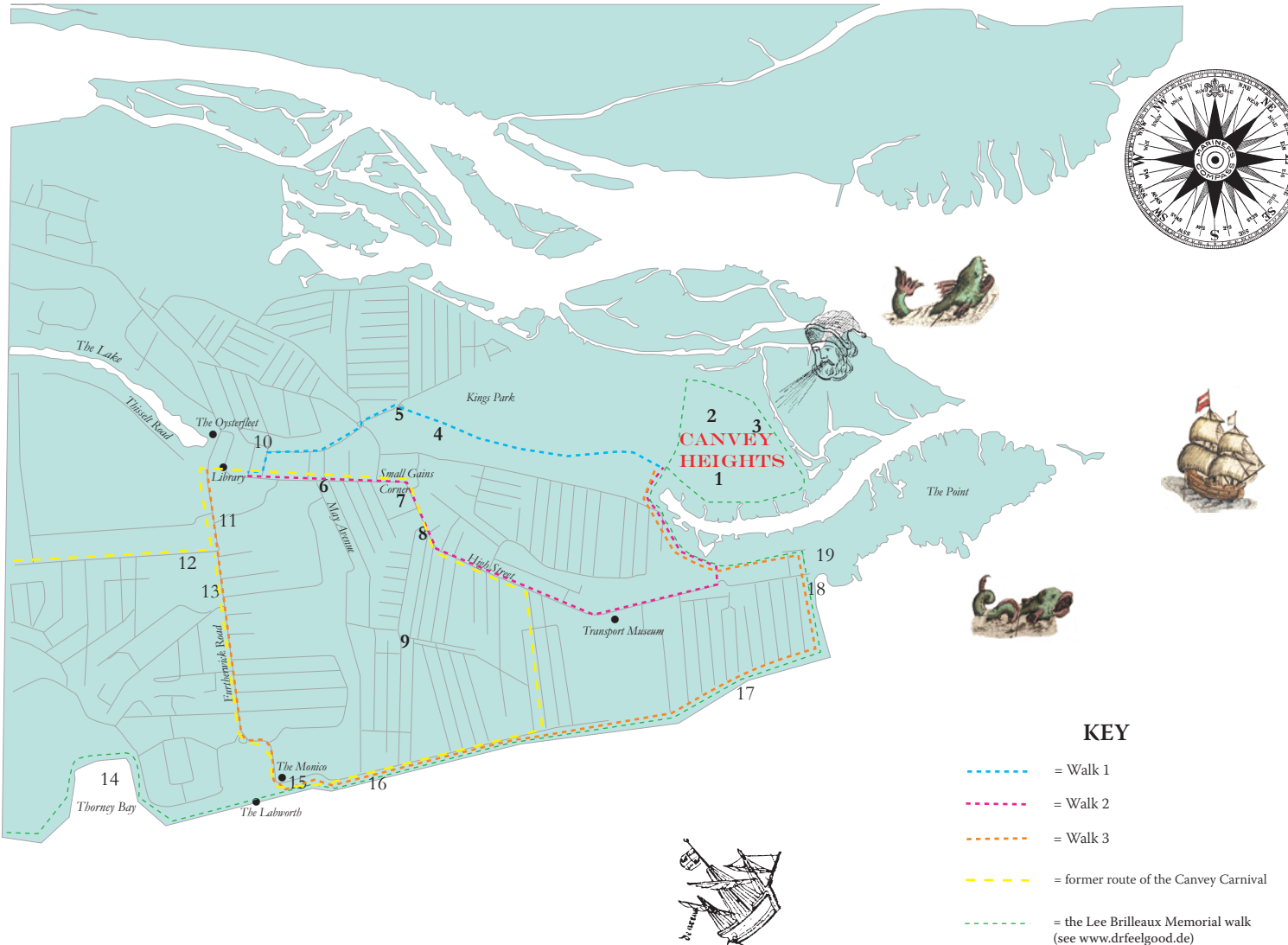


# Captivating Canvey: map showing points of interest

## POINTS OF INTEREST



1. Former location of Newlands Tip, which was at one time the location of luncheons for the crowning of the Carnival Queens
2. Viewing point for Long Horse Island, where Chris Fenwick remembers the scattering of the ashes of his friend Lee Brilleaux, lead singer of Dr Feelgood
3. Viewing Point for the train from Leigh, which Margaret Payne used to watch when her first boyfriend was on his way to meet her at Benfleet
4. Small Gains Community Hall and playing field, where the Island Boys and Girls football team practices
5. The fence near the roundabout at Mitchells Avenue, where a new pathway has been made by children (see no. 4) fetching their footballs through the hole
6. 2nd Hand Rose – for intriguing objects and furniture at bargain prices, next door to the former location of the Kynochs Club (the sign for which is still visible)
7. The Canvey Club
8. Former location of alleyway leading to the 'OK Coral' row of shops
9. Former location of the Settlement, which was partly built from the interior of a library from Battersea Rise House
10. Former location of the original Rendezvous Club on Waalwyck Drive, which was burnt down in 1933 and re-opened the following day as the Rainbow Club on Larup Avenue
11. Side wall of Fisks estate agents: the former location of the famous graffiti 'OZ NOW- YOU NEXT', and the former site of the 39 Cafe
12. The Paddocks, where Elvis Costello played a gig in 1979 and where, hidden in an upstairs room, there is a projection booth left over from when there was a cinema in the building
13. The Rio Cinema, now a bingo hall
14. Thorney Bay, where items from ships and other objects are often washed up (near to the place where a pupil from Castle View recently found a dead dog)
15. Former site of the Casino, now demolished, outside which there was once a fight between the Mods and the Rockers
16. Location of 'CANVEY IS ENGLAND'S LOURDES' graffiti
17. Approximate location of viewing point for the Chapman Lighthouse (now demolished) which was mentioned in Joseph Conrad's Heart of Darkness
18. Former site of the famous Concrete Barge, missed by many residents of Canvey, and the location of sightings of the Viking ghost
19. Pathway towards Canvey Point, a popular site for collecting Roman relics and former location of the crashed American plane.
